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## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE....

I want to thank your board for participating in the June 7 half day retreat to deal with many items affecting club operations. Key decisions include:

- 1) A position will be created under the Communications Committee to coordinate information included on our website.
- 2) The website will be used for our club's history. We will no longer use paper documentation for history. The last 2 years of activities will be available on our website's home page. As new events are added, the oldest will be moved to the archive section of our website starting with 2009 activities.
- 3) The Board approved an increase in annual membership dues to \$30 reflecting the increase in dues our club pays to FFI. Member approval will be required for this to take affect.
- 4) We will investigate the feasibility of offering a computer class for our members on using social media technology. FFI is encouraging clubs to use social media tools for communications.
- 5) The bylaws are being reviewed in their entirety. One change is making our financial year January 1 to December 31 in order to match our federal tax year.
- 6) The Board believers our club's name no longer describes us, so we are conducting a <u>name change contest</u>. (See page 5.)

Cheryl and Dale Moore have taken the leadership of our clubs community service outreach efforts. They will prepare a series of newsletter articles (see page 4) on potential opportunities.

Steve Williams will lead a group on a theme trip to Cincinnati from July 21 - 27 on the Underground Railroad. Results are determined by the distance jumped (measured from the back end of the dog) as recorded by high speed cameras. The competition took place over 3 days, June 20—22. According to the Dock Dogs national website, the longest jump of the entire event was 26' 8". WOW!

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## Community Service Page—Kids Against Hunger

Kids Against Hunger packages highly nutritious, life-saving meals for starving children and malnourished children and their families in developing countries and the United States. The goal of the organization is for its meals to provide a stable nutritional base from which recipient families can move their families from starvation to self-sufficiency. Kids Against Hunger accomplishes this by mobilizing the energy and caring of American children, teens, and adults on behalf of hungry children around the world. Kids Against Hunger seeks to end the literal hunger of children receiving the meals, but also satisfies a hunger among prosperous Americans – a hunger for meaning and contribution.

Kids Against Hunger's international headquarters is located in Bloomington, Minnesota. However, the key to the success of the organization is the more than 100 "satellites" located across the USA and Canada. There are 4 satellites in Iowa. Organizations such as service clubs, faith based groups, etc. host an event working through a satellite. Hosting an event involves purchasing enough product to package 1200 to 2000 meals, or more. The satellite hosts bring the product in bulk and the packaging equipment to a location selected by the hosting organization. The hosting organization supplies the

people to put the ingredients into individual meal packages, to seal the packages, and box the packages for shipping.

We have participated in several of these events through our church. It is, of course, very rewarding, but is also a time of good fellowship with the other participates. This is a project that our Friendship Force Club could easily do. Plus, the mission of Kids Against Hunger fits nicely with the International goals of Friendship Force.
