Again, a big thank-you to Vic Klopfenstein and all of those who helped Vic make the Russian Open World Program and World Friendship Day Celebration another success. A special thanks goes to those that hosted the Russian delegates: Shirley Rosencrans, Karen & Will Mickelson, Alice & Tom Wilkinson, Pat & Vic Klopfenstein, and Tressa & Irvin Youngbear.

This year's Open World Program was focused on accountable governance and democratic values. The Russian delegation consisted of 2 from the Rostov Region (150 miles from Sochi near the Black Sea), 2 from the Ryazan Region (about 100 miles from Moscow), and



the facilitator, Alexander, from St. Petersburg. Alexander holds a Master's Degree from Iowa State University. With what is going on in the world today, this may be our last Open World Program from Russia.

Exchange students from Tunisia (see page 1), Nicaragua, El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras attended the World Friendship Day Celebration. The students and our club members enjoyed the presentations by the Russian delegates about each of their home regions.
