## March Meeting Recap



Ron Ringgenberg from Youth for Understanding (YFU) in the Des Moines area presented an excellent program on the mission of YFU. Ron was accompanied by two YFU staff members from Cedar Rapids and an exchange student from Japan. This program was in recognition of World Friendship Day.

YFU is a non-profit international educational organization with organizations in more than 50 different countries. More than 260,000 students and their host families have benefited from the support and expertise of YFU. The YFU global

network is united by the belief that full cultural immersion is the most effective means to gain the skills needed to thrive in an increasingly multicultural, interconnected and competitive global society.

YFU's history began in the United States in 1951 in an effort to heal the wounds of World War II. Understanding that the hardships prevalent in Germany after the war were having devastating effects on the country's youth, placing them in a cycle of bitterness, hopelessness, and despair, American minister John Eberly made a proposal to church leaders. He asked to bring teenagers from war-torn Germany to the United States to live with a family and attend high school for a year. By teaching a group of young people how families lived together in the United States, the hope was that they would be motivated to return to Germany and rebuild the country as a democracy, according to what they had observed while living in the United States.

Today, YFU is a catalyst for positive global change. The impressions made by the students themselves and the broadened perspectives of host families; ripple through schools and across entire communities. YFU cultural exchange programs provide the ultimate reality check to a worldview based on stereotypes. YFU offers an adventure that reveals the best in people, and enables persons to make lifelong connections that will change the way they see the world. (Article edited from the YFU Website)
