In August, FFI will be holding its 40th Anniversary World Conference in Manchester, UK. The celebration begins at 6 pm on August 24 and ends at Noon on August 28. You are invited to the celebration. For nearly forty years, the Friendship Force has grown from being a dream of world peace to an international movement of friend-building overcoming the many cultural barriers that often separate people. The power of this movement isn't to be underestimated, and it is now the time to reintroduce the Friendship Force to a world in need of solutions. This 40th Anniversary World Conference marks an important time for all of us as we celebrate our past and talk about a plan already underway for the future. The conference will include:

Keynote speaker: Benedict Allen, TV Presenter, explorer and author. Benedict is best known for being the first to record his arduous and treacherous exploits without a TV crew. His technique has been to sink into remote communities, placing himself in the hands of these people and their environment, learning to survive from them alone.

Opening Night Party with 1970s theme—music, costumes, dancers, décor, food and atmosphere

Optional activities include: day tours in Manchester and beyond including a Beatles tour, indoor skydiving, the Imperial War Museum, The National Football Museum, a private canal cruise, city walking tours, an English Manor House and gardens, the BBC headquarters and a local brewery.

Headquarters Hotel: Our conference will be held in what is arguably Manchester 's most iconic building, The Midland Hotel, a grand Edwardian hotel, which opened in 1903 and has played host to kings, queens, presidents, prime ministers and rock stars. 

Steve Williams, was awarded the Wayne Smith Legacy Award at the club's annual meeting, November 13, 2016. Steve and his wife, Nancy, have long been an advocates of Friendship Force as active members of our Cedar Rapids/Iowa City club and previously as members of the Central Iowa club while residing in Marshalltown. His 'can do' attitude and willingness to take on challenges has been a great asset on the local, regional and global level. He is always an advisor to any board member requesting his assistance. Congratulations on this prestigious international award, Steve!

In addition to serving as president-elect in 2004, then club president in 2005, Steve accepted the challenge of being the club's first exchange coordinator from 2009 through 2011. He remained on the board – as secretary for several years after 2011, only re-

cently stepping down in 2014.

He has been exchange director many times, including leading global exchanges to Azerbaijan in 2010 and to Indonesia in 2013. In 2011, Friendship Force of Cedar Rapids/lowa City hosted its first themed exchange. Through a project arranged by FFI, Indonesian teachers spent a week in Iowa improving their language skills in English and absorbing the culture of the U.S. Midwest. As a result of Steve's dedication to this cause and the new concept, the club received an invitation to visit Indonesia, leading to a successful global exchange to Indonesia in 2013. In 2014, Steve led a 2014 domestic exchange on the topic of the Underground Railroad that was hosted by the Cincinnati club. He worked with a team to organize and lead Open World programs on education, social work/adoption, volunteerism, agriculture-business and small town government. Congratulations on this international recognition!

Open World September 2016 Recap

Looking back at our Open World hosting for three women and two men delegates along with a facilitator and an interpreter. This was an outstanding group of young professional educators from western Ukraine who were always attentive, asked questions and were involved.

Their week started out on Saturday September 24 with the group participating in Marion's Swamp Fox Festival in the morning and evening. They all went shopping in the afternoon at Lindale Mall. On Sunday, CR/IC Friendship member Joe Ironside hosted the group at Camp Courageous in Monticello with a pancake breakfast and tour of the facilities. Next they went to Dubuque and enjoyed a sack lunch on the edge of the Mississippi River and then to the National Mississippi River Museum & Aquarium. Sunday Evening was the Welcome Pot Luck at Pat & Vic Klopfenstein's home.

On Monday, the group attended a Round Table Discussion with the Grant Wood Area Education Agency representatives. Four Oaks Agency personnel, led by Liz Mathis, gave a very interesting and informative discussion how their agency met the needs of kids referred by DHS & the Juvenal Court System. Linn Mar Community School District hosted the Ukrainian group. The superintendent, administrators, principal, finance & operations as well as strategic planning led the discussion). The delegates were really involved by asking questions. They also toured the newly renovated High School, Aquatic Center & Stadium. Dr. Katie Mulholland, vice chairman, of the Iowa Board of Regents talked about her role as a board member governing the three Iowa Universities. They attended the work session of the Linn Mar School Board and learned of the role of the Board of Education.

On Tuesday, the Marion Independent School System was our host. There was dialogue on public education in USA and Ukraine, a tour and learning about the function of the Marion Independent School Foundation. East Cedar Rapids/Marion Rotary Club had the Open World Group as their speakers at a luncheon. Tom Ertz of the Marion Home School Assistance Program discussed their program. The delegates attended classes of their choice.

Wednesday included congressional Dialogue with Fred Schuster, Senator Grassley's Regional Director, Sam Pritchard, Senator Joni Ernst's Regional Director and Jack Mescher, Regional Director for Congressman Rod Blum. U.S Marshall Ken Runde for the Northern Judicial District of Iowa discussed his role. The afternoon was spent with Kirkwood Community College President Mick Starcevich and his Directors of International Students, Continuing Education and Distant Learning (High School College Credits divisions.) Shopping at Wal Mart in late afternoon.

On Thursday, the group visited the State Capital in Des Moines. The Honorable Terry Branstad and Lt. Governor Kim Reynolds discussed the importance of education in the State of Iowa in the Governor's Formal Office. Then they toured the Capitol - State of Iowa and the office of Dave Tilly, Deputy Director of the Iowa Board of Education in the State of Iowa. The Iowa Board of Directors (appointed by the Governor) set the policy for the Iowa schools and community colleges and let their boards carry it out. In the afternoon the Ukrainian Delegation visited and toured the Neal Smith National Refuge in Prairie City, IA where they saw an American Bison.

On Friday, Jeffrey Schott, Institute of Public Affairs, University of Iowa chaired a dialogue of school, municipal and county finance. They also visited the Marion Campus, boys residential housing, Four Oaks. Liz Mathis again was our spokesperson. Friday afternoon the delegation toured the Marion Vernon Junior High School and visited some classes.

After the Program Critique & Awards Ceremony with all Host Families in attendance, the delegation left for the Wickiup Outdoor Learning Center for the pot luck dinner with the CR/IC Friendship Force members and an International Quilters Friendship Force Program. Host Families were Pat & Charlie Kress, Alice & Tom Wilkinson, Jean & Dean Thomas and Pat & Vic Klopfenstein.
