You just don't 'go' to a World Conference, you experience and participate! The World Conference in Manchester from August 24-28 offered so many opportunities, I was amazed. Friendship Force of Manchester and the staff of Friendship Force International (FFI) did an excellent job of promoting it's mission of cultural understanding and citizen diplomacy.

During the course of the conference, we were given opportunities to explore Manchester and the area. The tour of Media City, the BBC campus, was very impressive. Two well-qualified young women, a radio actress who was very talented at presenting a variety of accents and emotions and a producer of a television wildlife show, led our tour. We walked through both television and radio sets for news, weather, drama and sports broadcasts, viewed dance costumes from BBC Dancing with the Stars and cheered Warren from the Adelaide, Australia, club on as he presented the weather report in front of green screen.

Opening Ceremonies started on a definite upbeat, we filed into the ballroom to find a djembe, an African drum, at each seat. It was a celebration, led by 3 African drummers, with each pro teaching a third of the room. Great way to wake up, harmonize and get going at 9 am!

Officials from Manchester, UK, and the Manchester FF club welcomed us. Jeremi Snook, FFI President and CEO, greeted us with enthusiasm and introduced the FFI staff who work with and encourage us. The theme of the morning was the 40th Anniversary of FFI. It was great to see what has been accomplished, hear testimonials from the early years, be recognized in video by US Rep John Lewis of Georgia and by letter from President Jimmy and Mrs. Roslyn Carter.

The Gala Banquet was held at the Manchester Airport, under a British Airways Concorde. Wow! The dinner was lovely and the speaker, Phil Holt, was excellent. Phil is a retired Air Traffic Controller and a Concorde afficionado. The first plane Phil cleared for take off was a Concorde at London's Heathrow Airport. Fun facts about the Concorde: Flight from London to New York in 3 ½ hours, twenty Concordes were built and they flew from 1969 to 2003. The four I attended were Media Relations, 40th Anniversary Campaign, Create and Maintain an Effective Board and A Closer Look at Manchester and the Midland. Kaohsiung and Taipei, Taiwan. November 1-15, 2017 Outgoing international journey



Open World-Kosovo Sept. 8 to 16

The Kosovo Open world delegation was exciting and filled with curious, knowledgeable young people. We learned of a close association between Kosovo and Iowa. There are two Kosovo Consulates in the US, one in New York and one in Des Moines, plus the Embassy in DC. The delegates learned a great deal about language development and immigration in Iowa. West Liberty was an eye-opener for all of us. We found a 53% minority population, with a low crime rate, bi-lingual education in the schools and great cooperation in the community. Both Dubuque and Des Moines told us how they welcome immigrants— the International Center is welcoming people to Des Moines who speak 190 different languages! We suggested to FFI, the delegates, and the Consul General, that our club help form a FF club in Pristina. Thanks to Dave Detwiler for following along with his camera for two days.
