are stripped of bark and then precision cut into boards for many uses. We were impressed at how much of the operation was highly computerized. They use all the by-products including sawdust



which is burned in their operations; hardwood mulch which is sold to garden centers, boards for pallets, and wood for custom furniture and cabinets.







The tour ended in the Markket, which sells home interior furnishings, including signs made in the furniture factory.

Mines of Spain Hike July 21





Thirteen club members ventured to the Mines of Spain by Dubuque to hike and learn about the history of this unique state park. We were able to browse the EB Lyons Visitor center and then were lead on a 1 hour hike around the center by DNR park manager Elli Lineburg. We learned that lead was mined in the early 1700s by Julian Dubuque who received permission from the King of Spain, hence the name Mines of Spain.





After leaving the visitor center we did the hiking loop through Horseshoe Bluff where the limestone for the Dubuque lock and dam was quarried. We ended our time in the park by visiting the monument and graves of Julian Dubuque and Chief Peosta and the beautiful view of the Mississippi below.



We ended the day with lunch at the 7 Hills Brewery in downtown Dubuque.
