IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

Below is an excerpt from Jeremy's message on the International Website

From the Desk of the CEO

Recently I attended a small event aimed to raise money and awareness for a new initiative being launched to bring the local international community together. Highlighting the event was the story of a friend who was granted asylum in the United States after a long and treacherous journey from Bosnia after being forced to evacuate during the war in the early 1990s. The room was silent as this accomplished University Medical Doctor talked about her Bosnian hometown being thrown into turmoil. Her town council hung onto the hope of brokered peace too long, while the bridge - the only way out of her city - was bombed and troops streamed into her town, systematically murdering her neighbors and friends in their homes. Her decision to cross the bridge that day saved her life and marked the beginning of a lifelong struggle to reconcile this experience with her new home and new life now here in the United States.

Her story of overcoming was inspirational, but it also served as a reminder that when we celebrate other cultures and people, we are also acknowledging their individual stories and lives. Going to another country is only the first step in our journey to truly understand the world around us. Every step beyond that is one step further away from the headlines and history books, and one step closer to truly understanding other people. For Friendship Force, this kind of story is a reminder of what we are about and why our journeys are making such a great impact.

At this very moment, wars continue between Israel and Palestine, Ukraine and Russia, and in a dozen other countries receiving far less media coverage. As we finish 2023, let us try not to get swept up into biased headlines. Instead, let us remember that within the context of these tragedies are the stories of real people, just like us.

My sincerest thanks to each of you who hosted, traveled, led and coordinated journeys as a part of pursuing Friendship Force's mission. My thanks to the International Board of

Directors and the FFI staff for setting direction and making sure our members and clubs were supported along the way. Happy holidays and see you all in the new year!

Open World-Kosovo March 15-23

Open World, run by COIL (Congressional Office of International Leadership) has accepted our proposal for a program on the topic of "Economic Development of Small and Medium Sized Municipalities". Content for the program can consist of meetings, panel discussions, job shadowing, lectures, community activities....anything pertaining to the top-



ic. There are 5 delegates, young professionals working in this field and a facilitator, usually from USAID(US Agency for International Development). If an interpreter is needed to assist with English skills, one will be assigned. Many times, the facilitator also acts as interpreter. At this point, we do not have bios on any of delegates or facilitator.

The group will arrive in Washington, DC, on March 13, getting some background information on the US government. They will fly into Cedar Rapids (CID) on March 15 and leave on March 23. While in Iowa, one day will be spent in Des Moines, where we will tour the Capitol, then visit with Fatmir Rrahmanaj and staff at the Kosovo Consulate. In addition to 28 hours of required content, there will be social opportunities to network and be hosts our guests. We will show the group Iowa hospitality, they will be interested in our culture as well.
