# Opportunity To Host Iraqi Youth July 14-27

Our club have been asked by Amy Alice Chastain at <u>Global Ties Iowa</u> about the possibility to host Iraqi and American youth (this group will have 9-10 Iraqi and 2-3 American teens) this July 14-27. They are still seeking to secure homes for 7 students.



IYLEP refers to <u>Iraqi Young Leaders Exchange Program</u>, a high school and undergraduate student program sponsored and funded by the U.S. Embassy, Baghdad and U.S. Department of State, <u>Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs</u>. Iraqi students are selected by the U.S. Embassy through a competitive application process. U.S. students also apply to participate in the month-long leadership program and are selected by World Learning staff.

During the program, high school students aged 15-17 develop leadership skills, learn about U.S. history and culture, and build a network of emerging leaders.


