The first two days provided cultural immersion by visiting Uptown Marion Market & meeting with former Marion Mayor Dr. Victor Klopfenstein and Mrs. Bonnie, a living history of community service and leadership. They also attended a Kernels baseball game and got acquainted with their hosts.

- Greater lowa City Inc. on regional collaboration and support systems for business growth.
- 10,000 Villages, learning about fair trade models and exploring potential future collaboration to bring Georgian crafts and social enterprise products to international markets.
- Beadology & Get Fresh Café, stories of women-owned business models built on values, sustainability, and local empowerment.

- Walker Homestead, agritourism, sustainability, and rural entrepreneurship in action.
- Cedar Ridge Winery, ShopHop Inc., and Calyx Creek Lavender Farm and Amana Colonies exploring branding, niche markets, and rural business success.
- Grant Wood Area Education Agency, powerful experience sharing about inclusion, disability services, and education.
- Children's Museum, inclusive design and absolutely amazing educational engagement
