from June 22-29, 2025. Some ambassadors were able to stay with Milwaukee members they hosted in 2024 when their club visited Cedar Rapids. The journey started with a welcome party at the clubhouse at the condos where Tommy Golding and Diane Soiber live. This is where hosts and ambassadors met.



The first

outing was to Wisconsin Museum of Quilts and Fiber Arts Museum in Cedarburg. The executive director gave us an overview of its exhibits which change quarterly. We viewed many types of quilts and other fiber arts. Afterwards we enjoyed lunch and free time to explore the interesting shops. The day concluded with

an outdoor play, The Inspector Calls, at Delafield Summer Theater in Lapham Peak

State Park. The next day started with a tour of the Veter-



ans Administration
Grounds at Wood. We
learned how the women
of Milwaukee saw a need
for housing of veterans
after the civil war and
raised \$100,000 (in mid
1860s!) The buildings
have been restored and
preserved and today



more than 100 low-income veterans live on the site.







Afterwards we enjoyed lunch at the Public Market, a large food court that also had unique shops. We visited the Milwaukee Art Museum, starting in the Calatrava-designed

Quadracci Pavilion. Bob Mitchell, a Milwaukee club member who is a long-time docent there gave us an overview of its modern art collections and a special exhibit on the works of El Greco, Velazquez and Zurbaran. In the evening, we were treated to home-hosted dinners and were able to meet more Milwaukee club members.



Friday morning was free to explore the city and visit with our hosts. Ambassadors enjoyed visiting quilt shops, touring Sprecher Brewing Company, learning to play Mexican train dominos, visiting a new children's park and strolling the river walk.





Attending Germanfest, which has been celebrated for more than forty years, was the highlight of Friday evening. At Henry Maier Festival Park, which is on Lake Michigan, we enjoyed German music, energetic dancing, great food, the glockenspiel clock with local men playing a comedy skit.
